OTHER DIVING AREAS

tropical paradise located in the Indian Ocean, each island is rimmed with stunningly white sand beaches that descend into vibrant blue waters. The Indian Ocean currents sweep through the atoll leaving behind nutrients to be caught by colorful and bustling reefs. There is a wide variety of topography to choose from that will please

all divers. Slopping reefs with a nice and easy drift, Pinnacles, swim-throughs, channels, walls, and much more. With the pushing and pulling of the nutrient-rich currents that run through the islands come pelagic giants. Manta rays, whale sharks, and giant sea turtles come to these islands to be cleaned and feed on the plankton that gets trapped in the island's lagoons.





Maaya Thila

A world-renowned dive site in the Maldives, featuring vibrant marine life such as white-tip and grey reef sharks, giant frogfish, turtles, and mantas. The reef spans about 80m in diameter and is suitable for both beginners and advanced divers. The site is known for its white-tip reef sharks, caves, and overhangs that house giant frogfish. Maaya Thila is a must-visit for anyone interested in diving in the Maldives.

Cocoa Thila

A 400m/1312ft pinnacle located on the eastern edge of South Male Atoll, known for its strong currents and best suited for advanced divers. The site's geographic features, including overhangs, ravines, and crevices, provide shelter from the current, making it an excellent destination to explore the underwater terrain. You can expect to see a variety of marine life, including schools of tuna and trevally, eagle rays, grey reef sharks, turtles, rock cod, fusiliers, sweetlips, and snapper. Additionally, Cocoa Thila offers stunning underwater landscapes, with its dramatic drop-off and unique terrain, providing divers with an unforgettable experience. Whether you're an experienced diver or a beginner, Cocoa Thila is a must-visit site for anyone traveling to South Male Atoll.



Alimatha Jetty

Vaavu Atoll is a great spot for a night dive due to the local marine life congregating under the jetty for an effortless feed. The dive is suitable for bold beginners with a max depth of 15m/49ft. Nurse sharks, giant trevallies, and marble rays are common sightings, and the creatures may even bump divers accidentally due to their excitement.





Kandooma Thila

This dive site in the Maldives features a submerged island with walls to explore, including Jack's Corner cave. Green sea turtles and larger marine life like sharks, mantas, and eagle rays can be seen due to strong currents. The coral is also spectacular and worth attention from macro photographers.

Banana Reef

On North Male Atoll is a popular dive site in the Maldives, offering a variety of marine life such as moray eels, sharks, groupers, jacks, snapper, wrasse, and Napoleons. It is accessible to all, including snorkelers, and features deep crevices, cracks, and excellent coral cover. However, its popularity also means that it can be crowded with day-trippers, divers, and snorkelers.

Fish Head

Fish Head, also known as Shark Point, is a popular dive site in the Maldives for shark enthusiasts. The walls are encrusted with corals and overhangs, and up to 20 grey reef sharks can be seen patrolling the reef. Other marine life includes fusiliers, trevally, barracuda, Napoleon wrasse, sea fans, black corals, and anemones.

Nassimo Thila

Also known as Paradise Rock or Virgin Reef, is Nassimo Thila, another very popular diving site in the Maldives. This Thila has a number of interesting pinnacles scattered a few feet away from the main reef. It boasts some fantastic rock formations and caves covered in blue and yellow soft corals, as well as an abundance of sea life - all you could want for the perfect dive. The top of the thila is between 10 and 15 meters and there is plenty of soft coral just waiting to be admired. Here you are likely to see midnight snappers, dog-toothed tunas, barracudas and even some white-tip reef sharks. This is a dive site that is suggested only for advanced divers as the currents at Nassimo Thila are usually strong.

Rainbow Reef

Also known as HP Reef or "Girifushi Thila", is Rainbow Reef - a Protected Marine Area. This is one of the best known and most beautiful dive sites in the Maldives. You can expect to see the top reef here coated in coral reefs, caves and crevices. Rainbow Reef has an unusual reef formation in terms of reef outcrops, caves and crevices so there is much to be explored and admired. Schools of trevally, snappers and dog-toothed tuna and eagle rays can be viewed here regularly.

They also have the sundeck at the back of the room where you can just sit and look out. The rooms themselves are amazing: huge windows, even in the bathrooms, which is really unusual,

and the layout is very good, lots of storage, lots of space, very well sort out, even the kids room.

The diving is amazing. Maldives is always beautiful, always a lot of sharks, sting rays, manta rays, very pretty reef. Like this morning we just did this "channel dive", so you dive into a big deep channel, and you hook on to the reef and the sharks are feeding right in front of you, it's really exciting.

The service is very good, they have enough staff, the dive guides are very good, good briefings, good plans, and they take us to very nice places, appropriate for the conditions and the experience level of the divers. The food and the cleaning are very professional.

The quality of the boat is also very good. The boat is a big deal, because if people say they have nice food, and the diving is good, but the boat is breaking down or something is not working it changes everything.

This boat is very shaded, so you can be protected from the sun, it could easily take 26 guests.

What's good from this boat is you can be on a deck and don't smell the diesel, some boats you will always have the smell of the fuels from the generator or the engine. This is a very important thing, especially for people new to the liveaboard, if you are not used to the smell.

have been diving for more than 20 years, with 3500+ dives and have been to Maldives many times, twice a year on average. I have dived around the world in many destinations, including Palau, Galapagos, Indonesia, the Philippines. services were very important. My nine days on MY White Pearl passed quickly and it was the trip was over before I was ready.





Blue Corner's diving environment: advanced divers





alau is an island nation in the Pacific Ocean, famous for its pristine coral reefs and diverse marine life. It has over 200 islands and more than 1,500 species of fish and 700 species of coral. It is also home to several unique phenomena such as the Rock Islands, the Jellyfish Lake and the Blue Holes. One of its most popular dive sites is Blue Corner,









attracts many fish and predators. The plateau also has coral formations and caves that provide shelter and hiding places for smaller creatures such as nudibranchs, shrimps and crabs.

Diving at Blue Corner is an exhilarating experience that offers a chance to see a variety of marine creatures, such as sharks, rays, turtles, barracuda, napoleon wrasse, jacks, snappers and more. The most common sharks are gray reef sharks and white tip reef sharks, but sometimes divers can also spot hammerhead sharks, whale sharks or tiger sharks. The rays include manta rays and eagle rays that glide gracefully through the water. The turtles are mostly green turtles and hawksbill turtles that feed on sponges and algae. The barracuda are often seen in large schools near the corner. The napoleon wrasse are huge fish that can grow up to 2 meters long and weigh up to 190 kg. They have distinctive humps on their heads and colorful patterns on their bodies.

The visibility at Blue Corner is usually excellent, ranging from 16 meters to over 28 meters depending on the tide. The best time to dive at Blue Corner is during incoming tide when clear ocean water increases the visibility and fish activity. The incoming tide waters hit the reef wall, forcing plankton and algae rich waters up and over onto the plateau providing nutrients for corals and fish. This creates a feeding frenzy

that attracts even more marine life to the area.

Blue Corner is considered one of the top dive sites in the world by many divers who have visited it. It is a must-see for anyone who loves diving and marine life. However, it is also a challenging dive site that requires good skills and experience. Divers should be aware of the potential hazards such as strong currents, depth, surge and boat traffic. They should also follow safety guidelines such as using reef hooks, diving with a guide or buddy, checking their equipment and air supply regularly. They should also respect the environment by not touching or damaging the corals or animals.

Blue Corner Diving Site in Palau is a dive site that will leave you breathless with its beauty and excitement. It is a place where you can witness nature's wonders up close and personal. You can see amazing colors, shapes and movements of marine life that will amaze you. You can feel the thrill of being surrounded by sharks and other predators that will make your heart race. You can enjoy the scenery of coral reefs that will make you appreciate their importance for biodiversity. If you are looking for an unforgettable diving adventure, Blue Corner Diving Site in Palau should be on your bucket list.


located at the northwest end of Ngemelis Island. It is about 25 miles (46 km) from Koror, the capital city of Palau, and can be reached by a 50 to 70 minute speedboat ride.

Blue Corner is a reef wall that drops from 8 meters to 30 meters deep. It has a plateau on top where divers can hook themselves to avoid being swept away by the strong currents that often flow through this area. The currents bring nutrient-rich water that

iving in Palau is a unique experience. It is one of the few place in the world where human development coexists in harmony with nature. Palau shelters 400 species of hard corals and 100 of soft coral and gorgonians. It is the habitat of more than 1,500 species of fish, and also 7 species of giant clams. The rock island Southern lagoon is famous for its beautiful scenery and unique marine life, including over 400 uninhabited limestone islands that rise from the sea, forming this exclusive environment.

Being in a remote area brings the benefit to have pelagic encounters, like sharks, mantas, dolphins and sometimes whales. Palau offers a wide variety of types of dives, plateaus, drop off, caverns, coral gardens, channels, plus wreck diving, shipwrecks of World War II. With a large number of dive sites, it is suitable for all levels of divers. It is the only place in the world where you can witness some special events following the moon cycles. Be delighted by authentic and very well preserved coral reef plunging from the surface to deep waters.





German Channel

During the German occupation of Palau Islands, German miners dredged a channel that connected the inner lagoon with the open ocean to transport phosphate. The currents going through the channel help get nutrients in and get waste out, inviting manta rays and large pelagics in from the open ocean. The German channel has plenty to offer. Mantas rays, reef sharks, whale sharks and hammerheads frequent the area, and the shallow reefs are home to a wide variety of macro life. Due to its remoteness, a diving liveaboard in Palau is the best option to explore this place.

Peleliu Express

Peleliu Express is one of the deepest and most beautiful dive sites in Palau. This dive site is an advanced drift dive site. A large variety of marine life finds shelter in the deep canyons, crevices, and caves that cut into the wall. The vertical walls are covered with corals and sponges attracting colorful butterfly and angel fish, as well as some turtles. It is one of the best spots to interact with countless sharks and dolphins. This place is only accessible from your diving liveaboard from Palau.



Turtle Cove

The vertical reef wall, with plenty of small caves, arches, ledges and reef sharks roaming around, is great for an introductory dive. On the top reef is a mini blue hole that forms a large cavern. The reef extends out to a plateau from and around Ngercheu Island. Different species of nudibranchs and schooling fish patrol the reef.



Chandelier Cave

This site was once an open-air cave but now a chain of cave system made up of five separate, connecting chambers with air pockets. Its dramatic stalactites and stalagmites formed, resembling glittering chandeliers. Salt and freshwater created a halocline inside the cave. Visiting the site just before sunset might be the opportunity to spot some cardinal fish or crabs on sponges. This site may not be favorable for divers who may be claustrophobic.

WEATHER, SEA CONDITIONS AND LENGTH OF TRIP MAY AFFECT THE ITINERARY AND DIVE SITES SELECTION.

DURING THE ROCK ISLAND AND SOUTHERN LAGON ITINERARY, WE WILL VISIT TWO MAIN AREAS OF ROCK ISLAND COMPLEX.

Ulong area shelters the famous dive sites of Ulong channel such as siaes corner and shark city. Between dives you can visit Ulong Island with its white sandy beach and its archaeological sites. A few hours sailing south east, we arrived at the German Channel. This channel is the border of Ngemelis coral system, which is part of Koror Rock Island Complex.



Ulong Channel

This breathtaking drift dive is unique to the archipelago. Numerous coral heads and coral formations decorate the sandy bottom of this channel. You are sure to find grey reef sharks, stingrays, snappers, barracuda and other pelagics. This is also one of the region's best places to search for macro and a prime location for spawning between April and July. Titan triggerfish dig out large grooves in the sandy bottom to lay their eggs due to their extremely territorial and protective nature when nesting on this site.

Siaes Tunnel

This deep underwater cavern offers divers an awesome experience as they dive through a large naturally-lit tunnel. Divers can see black corals, soft corals and invertebrates on the walls and ceilings of the tunnel . There are also white tip reef sharks and stingrays resting on the sandy bottom in the cavern. Currents can get strong here and the use of reef hook and safety marker buoy is mandatory.



Peleliu state (including Ngedebus and Carp Island) is on the other side of the channel. This area offers the opportunity to dive the well known Blue Corner and Blue Hole. German Channel is a must to dive as there are always chances to have an encounter with some mantas. This place also includes the beautiful coral garden of Ngesebus, Turtle cove with their stunning walls. For

experienced divers, and if the weather allows, we can visit Peleliu, and have the experience to dive at its amazing southern dive sites.



The Zeke Fighter

Allied forces called the Japanese Zero fighters "Zekes", and there are lots of them beneath the waters of Palau, all in varying condition. This particular wreck is in excellent shape, with the cockpit and instrumentation still intact. The starboard wing lies on the ocean floor just a short distance from the plane's body, but otherwise, she is still in one piece. Maximum depth here is just 17 meters, making this one site that is easy for all divers to enjoy.

Jellyfish Lake

Located off the coast of Koror in Palau, is a saltwater lake that was once connected to the ocean but is now cut off. The lake is home to jellyfish that have no natural predators and feed on algae. Though the jellyfish have stingers, they are too small to harm humans. Swimming is allowed, but scuba diving is prohibited to protect the ecosystem. The lake has two layers, with the upper layer being richer in oxygen and less saline, making it a more suitable environment for organisms like jellyfish and some species of fish. During the day, the jellyfish migrate from the west side to the east side of the lake to follow the path of the sun, which feeds the algae they survive on.





We offer 1 itinerary year-round: Palau Highlights as well as two special spawning trips every month.

Palau is also known as the host of the monthly spawning of thousands of bumphead parrotfish and red snappers. Every month, right around the full and new moons, we offer special spawning trips where divers will get to witness these fantastic natural events upclose.

Regardless, the diving in Palau remains fantastic yearround with the dry season running from October to May and the rainy season from June to September, with much of the rain occurring at night.







Other Spawning Trips 7 nights
